In this instance, what matters is beauty, and technology has answered the call for more DIY at-home rituals. ▲ **Ziip**

In what might amount to an easy facial, this sexy, sleek device relies on nanocurrents to interact with skin cells, calming them down and then encouraging them to produce more collagen and elastin. Ziip comes preloaded with the Energize Treatment – one of eight treatment programs available – but you can download others through the Ziip app, including Vital Eyes for dark circles and Instant Gratification for immediate lift. \$495



▲ **BelleCore Bodybuffer**

A Boston-based plastic surgeon, a medaled triathlete, and M.I.T. and Harvard trained engineers – the team behind BelleCore is impressive. Its body buffer offers vibration therapy, massaging for increased lymphatic drainage and diminished dimples. Treat cellulite and release tension from your muscles after a workout. \$149



▶ **NIRA Skin Care Laser**

Made in Massachusetts, this tiny skin care instrument targets crow's feet with non-fractional and non-linear lasers. The pinpoint element gently heats the dermis for collagen production, and guides you with beeps for placement, even alerting you if you aren't holding it at the right angle. \$499



▲ **Tria Hair Removal Laser 4X**

This hand-held device uses the same Diode Laser Technology dermatologists rely on for permanent hair reduction. Translation: Its narrowly focused light beam disables the growth of your hair follicles. All this hair-eliminating energy is FDA-approved, but grays and blondes are out of luck – the Tria works best on naturally light brown to black hair. \$449
